June 18 - 10am-5pm "U.S. Grant's Bicentennial Birthday Celebration." It's been 200 years since former 18th President and Civil War commanding Union General Ulysses S. Grant was born. To help celebrate, the Friends of Grant Cottage invite you to a fun-filled family birthday event on the grounds at Grant Cottage! The celebration will include an open house of the cottage, complimentary food (including birthday cake), music, a magician, games, face painting, and more. Meet General Grant (portrayed by living historian and Grant Cottage tour guide Steve Trimm) and sing Happy Birthday to the General. The popular 77th NY Regiment Balladeers will perform Civil War-era music during a one-hour concert beginning at 1:00 PM. # History Center to participate in Trailblaze NY at Hudson Crossing Park in Schuylerville

SCHC will join the Albany Symphony Orchestra and Hudson Crossing Park for a day full of activities for all ages for Trailblaze: NY, a free community concert and part of the 2022 American Music Festival series. SCHC will have a table and host two walking tours along the Champlain Canal at 11am and 2pm.

SCHC will provide the history. Do you want history? Oh boy, there will be HISTORY! This Saturday's Trailblaze NY Festival will feature history for all ages: Join SCHC Vice President and Saratoga Town Historian Sean Kelleher for *Fish Tales, the Mob, Corruption Investigations, and more from the Old Champlain Canal* at 11 am

(meet at the Junction Lock to the west of Lock 5 by the Mohawk Maiden parking lot) and then jump back in time at the Dix Bridge at 2pm for the 1777 Saratoga Siege Tour, a quick-paced 2 1/2 mile/90-minute walk.

Looking for more? Stop by HCP's Bridge of Boats overlook at 1pm for a National Park Service Ranger led talk about how 18th century armies dealt with natural obstacles such as the mighty Hudson River, including General Burgoyne's army as they moved south from Canada making their way to Albany, resulting in their crossing the Hudson via a "Bridge of Boats" right here at HCP! The events go on all day with the concert at 7:30pm. Hudson Crossing Park is centered around Champlain Canal Lock 5 Island, just north of Schuylerville, on New York State's Historic Scenic Byway, Route 4.

#### News from the Colonial Herb Garden...s...



My very favorite plant in the garden—the heirloom peony La Perle, translation The Pearl in English—is putting on a stellar show. My enchantment with this peony began as a child when I first saw its blossoms reflected in the tiny pool in my grandmother's garden. My grandmother showed my child-self the magic of the blossoms changing color. I was mesmerized. Mystified when I couldn't see the change happening before my eyes. Le Perle came down through our family's gardens before joining the fragrance bed at the museum where La Perle "performs" for all to enjoy.



The plant was perfectly named by François-Félix Crousse, a renowned French horticulturist who introduced this hybridized variety in 1886. La Perle has a delightful fragrance and its blossoms are purely pink when they open. Blossoms fade to a pale pearl as it ages and are completely white by the time the petals drop. How long the show lasts depends on the whims of Mother Nature. Hot temperatures rush the flowers through their season and rain leaves the stems bowed with petals weeping in too short a time.

Compared to many plants introduced by our early colonists, the peony is a late comer. They are naive to China and arrived here in the early 1800s by way of England and France. They quickly became a popular addition to early American gardens. I can't help but wonder what variety first grew at Brookside.



I'd be remiss if I overlooked the pesky peony-ant relationship everyone complains about when blossoms are gathered into a bouquet. The news is the ants are there for a reason, but are they needed to make the plant bloom? The Integrated Pest Management internet site at the University of Missouri debunks this myth. It explains, "Peony flowers provide food for ants and in turn, the ants protect the blossoms from other floral-feeding insects." Cooperation between species for the benefit of both! Mother Nature is amazing!

Flax: A Fast Pass in the Dyer's Bed



Delicate flax blossoms the blue of the bluest sky last for only a day. Fortunately they bloom over several weeks. They're not a dye plant but they are in the dyers bed because flax is the plant from which linen is woven. Flax was an important crop as linen was the predominant fabric used by the colonists until the invention of the cotton gin.



#### **Schuyler House Reopens**

Saratoga National Historical Park is excited to announce the opening of the Schuyler House on June 10, 2022. The house will be open Friday, Saturday, and Sunday through October 22. Tours

will begin at 10am, 10:30am, 11am, and 11:30am. An open house period will follow from 1pm to 4pm. Entrance is free, and the first floor is accessible for all visitors.



Saratoga National Historical Park preserves, protects, and interprets the sites associated with the battles, siege, and surrender of the British forces at Saratoga. The park encompasses five sites including the Saratoga Battlefield, General Philip Schuyler's House, Victory Woods, the Saratoga Monument, and Sword Surrender Site totaling 3,579 acres. It was here in September and October 1777, during the American War for Independence, American troops battled and defeated the British invasion force. A British Army surrendered, for the first time in history, on October 17, 1777. This crucial victory secured essential foreign recognition and support and boosted the morale of the American forces making it a decisive moment in the American Revolution.

The Schuyler House was part of a working estate that was owned by the Schuyler family from 1702-1837. The current house was built by General Philip Schuyler (1733-1804), a significant figure in the American War for Independence and early U.S. politics, in late 1777 after his previous home was burned by retreating British soldiers. The Schuylers accumulated vast landholdings and wealth from lumber, grist, and linen mills, timber and fish harvesting, agricultural production, and leased farm lots. Prior to 1804, the estate was also home to dozens of men and women enslaved by the Schuylers to work in their various enterprises and support their lifestyle, here and at their mansion in Albany.

Visitors this season will enjoy extensive interior renovations to return the house closer to its late 18th, early 19th century appearance. The restoration and upkeep work includes updating exhibits

with replica floor coverings, wallpaper, and furniture. Work will continue throughout the summer to repair and preserve some wooden decorative elements, the roof, and upgrades to the pathway from the parking area to the house for improved accessibility.




