Visiting the sites that relate to General Philip Schuyler and his family within the current landscape. Philip Schuyler was an American general in the Revolutionary War and a United States Senator from New York. He established a large plantation in Saratoga and helped develop the area. Meet at Schuylerville Veterans' Memorial Park: US 4 and NY 32 adjacent to Fish Creek Schuylerville, NY 12871. Parking is available along the village streets. The tour distance is expected to be one mile and the duration approximately one hour. The suggested donation is \$10 per registration. In the Saratoga Style: Potato Chips and Their Regional Folklore opens Saturday, July 30 at Brookside Museum

The Saratoga County History Center at Brookside Museum proudly announces the opening of the new exhibit "In the Saratoga Style: Potato Chips and Their Regional Folklore". This exhibit explores the many stories that have claimed to explain the story behind the snack, from disgruntled customers to kitchen mishaps. The history of the legendary George Crum is examined, along with his experiences as a cook and outdoor guide of African and Native American ancestry. Learn more about this contender for the inventor of potato chips, along with other possible innovators who may have been responsible for the irresistibly crispy potatoes.

The use of the "Saratoga" name to nationally market potato chips is seen through the expansive collection of famed local expert Alan Richer, known as "The Toga Chip Guy," (togachipguy.com) who has generously partnered with the museum to make part of his collection available to the public. Items include sheet music for the 'Potato Chip Song,"; images from 19th century Saratoga Springs, and tools used to make "Saratoga Chips." In discussing the importance of this food to American society, Richer says "Potato chips are more American than apple pie. Compare the shelf space allotted to potato chips and apple pie in your local grocery store. Regardless of your view of the origin of the chip, there can be no doubt that potato chips were popularized in Saratoga Springs as evidenced by the fact that the first generic name for all potato chips was Saratoga Chips."

Curated by SCHC Education Director Anne Clothier and SCHC Trustee Fred Sober, the exhibit is open to the public Thursday through Sunday, 1 pm - 5 pm. According to Sober, "Brookside Museum is again bringing local history to life, with our new exhibit, highlighting our local connection to an everyday delicacy enjoyed around the world. We are proud to present this exhibit, and invite you to join us for this interesting (and delicious!) trip into Saratoga County's past."


August 4 - 12pm "Iron-Hearted: The 115th NYS Vol. Regiment in the Civil War." During the Civil War, Colonel Simeon Sammons received authority to recruit a regiment in the counties of

Fulton, Hamilton, Montgomery, and Saratoga, with headquarters at Fonda. On August 26, 1862, it mustered into the service of the United States for three years. Join local historian David Brooks in an exploration of the history of the "Iron-Hearted Regiment." Journey along with them from Upstate NY to the Deep South and back. Discover the battles they faced on the front line and those experienced from within. This event will be held outdoors, weather permitting, on the library's "porch." In case of rain, we will convene in the Community Room on the main floor. David Brooks is the Education Director at Schoharie Crossing State Historic Site in Fort Hunter, NY and sits on the board of the Fulton County Historical Society, based out of the Fulton County Museum in Gloversville, NY. As a native of that County, growing up, he heard tales of local history and how his own ancestors fought to preserve the Union during the tumultuous Civil War The Saratoga Springs Public Library is located at 49 Henry Street, Saratoga Springs, NY 12866-3271. August 12 – 6:30pm "**Bells, Bells**" Outdoor lecture presented by Michael Barrett at the Waterford Historical Museum and Cultural Center at 2 Museum Lane, Waterford, NY 12188. August 20 - 1pm "Heritage Hunters: Guided Tour of the Hugh White Homestead" The Waterford Historical Museum and Cultural Center will welcome the Heritage Hunters and friends on a guided tour. Begun in 1830, the house was built in several two-story sections on Saratoga Avenue in Waterford, NY and moved to 2 Museum Lane in 1964. Hugh White was born into a prominent Oneida County family in 1798. He was drawn to the Waterford area when he and his brother developed a waterproof cement product that was much in demand for use in canals and dams. The group tour costs \$5 per person. It will run 30-45 minutes, after which there will have free time to explore on your own. 


News from the colonial herb garden...

A garden is a magical place—metamorphosing from an expanse of barren soil in March to lush beauty in July.



Tucked behind the vibrant orange flowers of calendula are the magenta blossoms of betony—this week's plant celebrating its time in the sun. Betony (*Stachys officinalis*) is an ancient herb, regarded as magical by the Egyptians, and well into the late 1600s, believed to have the power to ward off harm. The Romans used it to treat forty-seven conditions, and some medicinal benefits are still recognized today. Betony leaves and flowers, both fresh and dried, make a caffeine-free tea with a taste similar to black tea. Experiment by adding other herbs. Steep 5 minutes before enjoying.




This week I noticed an unusual insect I had never seen before on betony's scalloped, dark green leaves. A butterfly or moth? I quickly took a photo before it flew away. My research didn't find an answer so I sent the photo off to my cousin who is known for her knowledge of insects. Within half an hour, I had the answer—an Haploa confusa, a native moth.
