Saratoga County Funds a Community History Exhibit at the History Center

Covid Money Funds an Exhibition on the History of Saratoga County

The Saratoga County History Center in Ballston Spa announced a \$25,000 grant from the Saratoga Non-Profit Relief Grant Fund. These funds will support an immersive exhibition designed and built by professionals on the history of Saratoga County to open in spring 2023.

"The History Center was challenged by COVID, and the community has supported us by increased memberships; however, the organization needed help regaining fiscal momentum with exhibitions, the lifeblood of a museum," explains **Field Horne**, **president of the SCHC**. "The support of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors makes possible our strategic plan developed by SCORE volunteers, a partner of the U.S. Small Business Administration at the Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce."

Saratoga County Board of Supervisors Chairman, Theodore T. Kusnierz, Jr., said, "The Saratoga County History Center provides an immeasurable service in their dedication to the preservation of our county's rich history and is a deserving recipient of a Saratoga County Non-Profit COVID Relief fund grant. This \$25,000 grant will help the Center continue to provide our residents and visitors with an inviting space to learn about important events and people in Saratoga County history."

Sean Kelleher, SCHC 1st vice president, said, "This grant represents the faith of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors in the value of SCHC as a benchmark cultural institution in our region, and cultural institutions have long been a critical sector in our economy. As we continue rebuilding a stronger Saratoga County, we must do all we can to help this industry thrive. SCHC will be able to continue educating people as we approach the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution and help spur revitalization in our community."

"We are delighted and honored. The funding will help SCHC deliver on its mission to bring a deeper understanding, for residents and visitors alike, of how the past informs and impacts our present and future in Saratoga County," added **Isobel Cornell, 2nd vice president of SCHC**. With this grant, the organization will create an exhibit with a lifespan of about a decade. An exhibit of this magnitude and quality should result in a steady audience and sustainable fiscal support. This development should lead to additional partnerships with cultural and educational institutions and increase outreach to audiences and donors.

November 17 - 7pm "The River Before Henry: First Nations, Last Elephants" with Tom Lake is a naturalist and educator for NYSDEC's Husdon River Estuary Program. The indigenous peoples of the Hudson Valley lost their sense of innocence 413 years ago when Europeans "discovered" the Hudson Valley. The Munsee, Mohicans, Lenape, Haudenosaunee, and others did not realize they were missing. Europeans had little regard for the tribal people they met, after all they lacked a written language, a recognizable religion, and they allowed females too much autonomy. Yet, these tribal people could trace their ancestry back 415 generations. Since 1609, the Hudson Valley has seen less than seventeen. This is the story of their ancestors across millennia, during which time they created homelands, developed new technologies, connected with neighbors near and far, and expanded trade routes, while cultivating a rich cultural heritage and an oral tradition back to the time of the First Nations and Last Elephants. The Saratoga County History Center at Ballston Spa's Brookside Museum has launched its Annual Appeal, "Finish the Job," with the objective of complete stabilization of the historic building in the coming year. Its goal of the current phase, \$45,000, will fund energy efficiency and long-postponed repair of space required for museum operations and care of its important collections. Two friends of the museum have pledged \$15,000 to match an equal sum from the community.

"Finish the Job" will make the museum's most economical operation possible. Its storm windows are 70 years old and do little to keep out the weather. Replacement with modern, efficient storms is planned before midwinter. New interior and exterior lighting, for the comfort of museum visitors and to reduce energy consumption, will use LED technology. An area of the building damaged many years ago by a leaking roof was to be gutted and converted to badly-needed storage. Finally, since most of the museum's galleries have been renovated, only two floors must be repaired and refurbished.










Heritage Hunters Meeting, November 19, 2022

Forty-five years ago, the Ballston Spa Public Library became the recipient of a special collection of roughly 1000 books and other items representing the history of Saratoga County, and along with it, a *Bibliography* two inches thick with references to the county that could be found in works all over the world. Dr. Bruce M. Manzer, a former Ballstonian who was then an associate professor of library science at the Illinois State University, had spent 17 years on the project.

The Heritage Hunters meeting on November 19 will take place at 1pm at the Ballston Spa Public Library, where Library Director Andrea Simmons will explain Manzer's *Bibliography*, and we will be able to view the non-book items as well as the books in the collection and see how references in the *Bibliography* might be of use in future research. As per agreement with the donor, the Manzer collection is kept separate from the library's local history collection, in two special cabinets. Andrea enlisted the help of a graduate student intern this past year to help make the non-book materials more accessible for viewing.

Dr. Manzer had a long career in several different scientific research institutions, and most notably, worked for over 30 years in Bahrain. Now retired, he has made good on his promise to continue adding to his work and has since produced the 4th edition of Manzer's *Bibliography of Saratoga County*. Different editions of the work are viewable in many of the county's public libraries.

Andrea Simmons has been the director of the Ballston Spa Public Library for 19 years.
