

<u>Historian Walking Tour: Waterford 1810–1880</u> Tuesday, September 26: 1pm – 2:30pm

Waterford Town Historian, Russ Vandervoort, will lead a walking town of downtown Waterford, describing local landmarks and influential residents who lived there in the mid-19th century We will hear Russ' lively stories of local politician John Cramer, Lysander Button inventor of fire apparatus equipment and several others interesting residents of Waterford.

The walk will begin at the Harbor Visitors Center. There is some parking there, as well as Lock 2 Park, and the Battery. From there we will walk up 3rd St. to Broad St and then head to the Union Bridge area at the Hudson River and complete the walk on Maiden Lane and Pearl St. The participants who parked at the Visitors Center or the Battery will be less than two blocks from their cars. Lock 2 Park, a little further away. Recommended donation is \$10 per group (individual, couple or family), but please input the expected number of people in the group so that we can keep track of numbers.

The War with Mexico was the inevitable result of the constant westward movement which came to be known as the United States' "Manifest Destiny" to expand our nation to the Pacific. In 1847 local men answered the call by joining volunteer and regular army regiments to support the war effort. Some did not return. John Cromie is a local historian, and Saratoga County History Center Trustee. Dave Waite, is a well-known photographer, videographer and Brookside Museum volunteer. Both men are published authors who have made extensive contributions to Saratoga County history.

Galway Preservation Society Meeting

Monday, October 2: 7pm

Doors will open at 6:45pm, followed by a program at 7:00 pm on "Galway Fire Company" given by Kevin Barkley, former Galway Fire Chief. This year the Galway Volunteer Fire Company celebrates their 100th anniversary, having been incorporated in 1923. The first firehouse was housed in an 1850's building that was once a wagon hub factory, an undertaker's establishment, a general store and a Texaco gas station before becoming the first official Galway firehouse.

The second firehouse, built in the 1940's on the west side of South Street, was ravaged by fire in late 1959. The third and larger firehouse was rebuilt in the same location in 1960, with an addition in 1980. To keep up with a growing community, a modern 12,000 square foot four bay firehouse was built on West Street in 2017.

Please join us to hear more of our local history and the story of our Galway Volunteer Fire Company. The

meeting will be held at the Galway Town Hall, 5910 Sacandaga Rd., Galway. The meetings are always open to the public, free of charge.

The conference will be held in person at the Saratoga Town Hall. Historians will be presenting from 9am until 11:45am (Presentations by John Scherer, Maryann Fitzgerald, Rick Reynolds, and Russ Vandervoort). From 11:45am to 12:45pm, Schuylerville Pizza and Pasta will be catering lunch. They will be serving a penne pasta in marinara sauce with meatballs, salad, and bread. There will also be cake for dessert. Sean Kelleher will present from 12:45pm until 1:15pm, after which a historians' panel will take place from 1:15pm until 2pm.

The conference, including lunch, is \$20 per person for members, \$25 for non-members. Non-members can choose to become members simultaneously, with an extra two months added to their

subscription. Membership includes an informative bi-monthly newsletter, which contains local records not usually found online.
