

Book Launch and Signing for Letters from a Civil War Soldier

The Historical Society of Moreau and South Glens Falls will launch a book of letters from a Civil War solider to John Bentley, who grew up in the Glens Falls area. Titled "*Dear Friend!* – *Letters from Union Soldier Gustavus Wintermeyer to John A. Bentley*", the book includes thirty letters depicting what military life was like in the 1860s.

The book launch and signing will be held September 9 at Parks-Bentley Place (noon to 4 pm). Purchase price is \$19.99. The organization also plans to update its website to offer online sales but orders via mail can be placed using the form on the organization's website at <u>www.parksbentleyplace.org</u>.

The Historical Society maintains its Parks-Bentley Place headquarters at 53 Ferry Boulevard in South Glens Falls. This historic home is one of the three oldest buildings in South Glens Falls, but is the only one open to the public.

Mr. Wemple will present the history of the Trevett & Sons Chair Factory which was located in the town of Providence. The factory was in operation from the mid 1800s until early 1923, making thousands of chairs. The meeting will be held at the Galway Town Hall, 5910 Sacandaga Rd., Galway. Please join us. The Saratoga County History Center will host David Brooks, Education Director at Schoharie Crossing State Historic Site in Fort Hunter, NY, on Wednesday, September 13th at 7pm in the Long Room at Brookside Museum.

During the Civil War, Colonel Simeon Sammons received authority to recruit a regiment in the counties of Fulton, Hamilton, Montgomery, and Saratoga, with headquarters at Fonda. On August 26, 1862, it mustered into the service of the United States for three years. Join local historian David Brooks in an exploration of the history of the "Iron-Hearted Regiment.", the 115th New York Infantry Regiment. Journey along with them from Upstate NY to the Deep South and back. Discover the battles they faced on the front line and those experienced from within.

David Brooks also sits on the board of the Fulton County Historical Society, based out of the Fulton County Museum in Gloversville, NY. As a native of that County, growing up he heard tales of local history and how his own ancestors fought to preserve the Union during the tumultuous Civil War. Waterford Town Historian, Russ Vandervoort, will lead a walking town of downtown Waterford, describing local landmarks and influential residents who lived there in the mid-19th century We will hear Russ' lively stories of local politician John Cramer, Lysander Button inventor of fire apparatus equipment and several others interesting residents of Waterford.

The walk will begin at the Harbor Visitors Center. There is some parking there, as well as Lock 2 Park, and the Battery. From there we will walk up 3rd St. to Broad St and then head to the Union Bridge area at the Hudson River and complete the walk on Maiden Lane and Pearl St. The participants who parked at the Visitors Center or the Battery will be less than two blocks from their cars.
