# <u>Victory Season at Saratoga: Surrender Day Ceremony</u> Thursday, October 17, 9:30am Fort Hardy Park, Schuylerville

The 247th anniversary of the British surrender at Saratoga continues to mark America's Turning Point in its War for Independence. Come celebrate British General John Burgoyne's agreement to ground their arms with American General Horatio Gates, which was the decisive turning point victory of the American Revolution. A victory that helped secure France's formal military alliance. The Surrender Day Ceremony includes live cannon firing and military reenactors, sing-along participation from local students & teachers, historical stories, and a recreation of the famous sword surrender.
