<u>Experts Next Door #25 – The CCC in Saratoga County and the Adirondacks</u> Wednesday, November 6, 7 - 8:30pm Online Event

Join Marty Podskoch, historian and author of 11 books, as he discusses the role and legacy of the CCC in our area. The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) began on March 31, 1933 under President Roosevelt's New Deal to relieve the poverty and unemployment of the Depression. Workers built trails, roads, campsites, dams, stocked fish, built and maintained fire tower observer cabins and telephone lines, fought fires, and planted millions of trees. The CCC disbanded in 1942 due to the need for men in WW II. There were over 200 CCC camps in New York State, including one locally in Stillwater, from where men worked developing Saratoga Battlefield as an historic site. **This is an online event. A Zoom link will be sent out within 24 hours of the start. This event is free for members. There is a suggested donation of \$5 for non-members, but any**

donations are always welcome and gratefully received.
